





Progress Towards Senior Phase






Compulsory subjects

| Health and Wellbeing | PSE | 2 periods per week |





Negative Considerations

- > Choose a subject just because they like or dislike the teacher
- > Pick a subject just so they can be in the same class as their friends
- > Worry if they have no clear career ideas yet keep their options open
- Limit their future career options by thinking that some subjects and careers are limited by gender



School Constraints

- > This depends on us having enough teachers to staff the class





"Technology and globalisation are creating new, dynamic and **increasingly complex economic contexts to navigate**".


Disruption and rapid change will alter the future of work; affecting not just the type of work we do, but the way we do it.

Career Management Skills



- Career management skills are essential to navigating the rapidly changing labour market.
- CMS supports the development and use of skills that best enable individuals to plan and pursue life, learning and work opportunities
- The development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work are embedded within the Curriculum for excellence...this is an entitlement for all young people

The Changing Youth Labour Market

- The youth labour market has changed massively over the last couple of decades
- There are fewer entry-level jobs for school leavers and much more competition for them
- There are many and varied routes into work for young people; including Modern Apprenticeships, college, university or further training



The Changing Youth Labour Market

- > The average person has 10 15 jobs in their lifetime
- > 80% of jobs are not advertised
- This means young people have to be very well prepared for the world of work


