## Senior Phase Curriculum Entitlements


- A curriculum which provides specialisation, depth and rigour

## The S6 Experience

Depends on the students' starting point:

- \* Attained sufficiently well in S5 to get where they want to go and now adding value.
- \$ S5 attainment not what was expected and need to spend S6 getting the results they need.
- \* Somewhere in between.
- But every case has the same end point -this will be your child's last year in school and they must make the most of the time and the opportunity.

## West Lothian Academy

- You may have heard this called the "virtual campus"
- Tuesday and Thursday online learning with one of these afternoons online teaching via Teams. Therefore, maximum of 2.
- In-person tutorials, approx. twice per term in a central location.
- Tracking, parents' evening
- You must commit for the full year, withdrawing will not be an option

- Pick a subject just so they can be in the same class as their friends
- Worry if they have no clear career ideas yet keep their options open
- Limit their future career options by thinking that some subjects and careers are limited by gender







"Technology and globalisation are creating new, dynamic and increasingly complex economic contexts to navigate".


Disruption and rapid change will alter the future of work; affecting not just the type of work we do, but the way we do it.

# Career Management Skills



- Career management skills are essential to navigating the rapidly changing labour market.
- CMS supports the development and use of skills that best enable individuals to plan and pursue life, learning and work opportunities
- The development of skills for learning, skills for life and skills for work are embedded within the Curriculum for excellence...this is an entitlement for all young people

# The Changing Youth Labour Market

- The youth labour market has changed massively over the last couple of decades
- There are fewer entry-level jobs for school leavers and much more competition for them
- There are many and varied routes into work for young people; including Modern Apprenticeships, college, university or further training



# The Changing Youth Labour Market

- > The average person has 10 15 jobs in their lifetime
- 80% of jobs are not advertised
- This means young people have to be very well prepared for the world of work



### **LEAPS** Eligibility Criteria




In <u>Group 2 schools</u>, we support students who have the potential to achieve a minimum of 3 Highers by the time they finish school and match one or more of the following criteria;

- student who is first generation in family to apply to higher education or whose parents do not already have a degree.
- student from a low income background (for instance where a student is entitled to EMA, free meals in school, or where the family is entitled to a benefit such as Universal Credit).
- student who has spent time in care or being looked after
- student who is estranged
- student who is a young carer
- students may also be eligible based on their postcode (SIMD 20).
