AS: Currently there is no plan for a pool but space has been set aside to allow it if funding becomes available. Ongoing discussions involving senior Council Officials, Councillors, SG Officers, MSP and MP regarding funding of the project which will determine the final design.

Members of Parent Council will approach their Elected Members.

Question: Is this having an impact on current staffing provision.

AS: We are managing current staff absences and staff turnover is on a par with previous years.

	AS: No final decision has been made on this to date.	
	SC: The Authority have agreed to fund and look to re-design student toilets next summer.	
	The hoped for plan is to have individual cubicles with washhand basins situated behind a glass panel which will greatly reduce opportunity for vandalism.	
	As noted that we have been subject to vandalism in the TU huts, school sanctions have been applied to identified students.	The Parent Council will issue a statement to the wider school community about ongoing vandalism.

	AS: Students will always have the opportunity of hot food available throughout all three lunch breaks and we haven't had this concern raised by any students or the canteen staff.

Partnerships – Over the next few Head Teacher updates we will be bringing you news on some of our partnership work. The first is about our newly established partnerships with Heron Bros and BDP Architects, aiming to provide students with valuable educational opportunities in the workplace. Collaborating with Heron Bros, students will contribute to creating environmentally friendly products that enhance aesthetics during our construction as well as being involved in Eco activities helping to promote wildlife benefits. Staff representatives from Heron Bros will also engage with students, offering insights into the construction industry, fostering awareness of potential employment and training opportunities.

At the same time, discussions are underway with BDP Architects, who have been awarded the contract for the new building's design. Two S6 students with a passion for architecture will have the chance to visit the BDP Architects studio in Glasgow, gaining first-hand experience, learning from the team, visiting completed projects and possibly completing a work placement with them.

These partnerships aim to enrich our students' understanding of the Construction and Built Environment industry, opening doors to practical learning experiences and potential career paths.

Cost of the School Day Group

We are the St Kentigern's Academy Cost of the School Day group. We are a group made up of young people from across our community, from all walks of life and backgrounds, reflecting the diverse nature of our school.

As a group within our school we've undertaken various initiatives to address the challenges associated with the cost of the school day and to help make our school as inclusive as possible for all pupils.



We held a very successful winter coat drive, where we collected scarves, coats, hats, and gloves for those in our community who might need them. We involved not just our pupils within our school but also through communication via school assemblies and social media we managed to involve the wider community. The result was a substantial boost in donations, making a meaningful impact on those in need.

We have established 'help yourself' trollies with toiletries, in four locations across the school, and our approach to these trollies means no one needs to do without the basics. And we have done this in a way where there is no stigma attached with using the trollies.

We have worked with the school catering staff to look at the menu options and prices in our canteen. Following this we have been involved in directly contributing to the changing menus across all the schools in West Lothian, helping increase variety and value.

Our group has presented to parents and our peers about the issues surrounding the cost of

living crisis and the supports available, including promoting our school Financial Inclusion Officer. We have engaged with S1 to S3 classes during Poverty Action week, creating lessons where all groups looked at the impact of the Cost of Living Crisis, and have visited registration groups to remind them about the services available to them in the wider community.

As part of our school environmental activities we helped support the school Sustainable Prom Fashion Show and we now just completed a survey of pupil about what our group could do next to support the school community.

Now, we are going to examine the language we use to discuss poverty in our school and community, while working with staff to make sustainable policies and practises around the cost of the school day. We are proud of what we have achieved in partnership with the staff in St Kentigern's Academy, and we intend to keep doing what we do as a group - making a positive difference to our community.
